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VALUES

We are all born as empty vessels which can be shaped by moral values...

I have thought for many years now that there is a growing divide between the principles and values we hope to teach at school and the crumbling morals of the world outside our gates. In our foyer, we proudly display our values, which include these key words:

TRUSTWORTHYNESS, RESPECT, TOLERANCE, CONSIDERATION, RESPONSIBILITY, ACCOUNTABILITY and FAIRNESS.

I wonder about these words and the meaning they truly hold. Yet as a place of learning responsible for the shaping of young minds, we have to hold fast to these values and instill them to the best our ability. With our parent body, we share the responsibility to hold the moral compass for the children in our care and teach them right from wrong... because they are still children and if we fail to do so, we invite disaster. This is not new to us. In 400 BC, the Greek philosopher Socrates wrote:

"The children now love luxury; they have bad manners, contempt for authority; they show disrespect for elders and love chatter in place of exercise. Children are now tyrants, not the servants of their households." A similar sentiment is echoed in "The Crucible" (set in 1692 and written in 1953) by Arthur Miller, when he writes: '...but now the little crazy children are jangling the keys of the kingdom".

This week, we heard the news of a group of young people from our town who have been charged and jailed for theft. More shocking still was the tragic news of the suicide of a young grade 10 girl from a nearby school, allegedly following a bullying incident at her school. Where does the blame lie? Who is responsible? What would Socrates make of the youth of today?

I don't know all the answers but I do know that at our school, we will not let go of what we know to be right. We will stand fast by those values and use them each day to guide those who teach and those who learn here.
