

# Dear Parents

Considering the announcement of our Leader Council for 2023/2024 that took place yesterday, I share an extract from the message delivered at their induction.



#### SERVANT LEADERSHIP

Servant Leadership is a timeless concept, the phrase "servant leadership" was coined by Robert K. Greenleaf in 'The Servant as Leader', an essay that he first published in 1970. In that essay, Greenleaf said: "The servant-leader is a <u>servant first</u>... It begins with the natural feeling that one wants to serve, to serve first".

In 'Wired Differently', Vern Dosch writes that, "In a servant leadership culture we learn by choice or example that if we want to be great, we have to serve others respectfully." Conscious choice then, brings one to aspire to lead. That person is sharply different from one who is leader first, perhaps because of the need to ease an unusual power drive or to acquire material possessions...

The leader-first and the servant-first are two extreme types. The difference manifests itself in the care taken by the servant-first to make sure that other people's highest priority needs are being served. A servant-leader focuses primarily on the growth and well-being of people and the communities to which they belong. While traditional leadership generally involves the accumulation and exercise of power by one at the "top of the pyramid," servant leadership is different. The servant-leader shares power puts the needs of others first and helps people develop and perform as highly as possible.

Under a servant leader, people come together for a common purpose. They can create a feeling of belonging to something bigger than each individual, and foster team spirit and a sense of community. Servant leaders also deeply care for this community that they create.

To the Grade 11 body, every last one of you, will be in a position of Servant Leadership next year, as the seniors of the school, those below you on the ladder look up to you for guidance, support and an example of kindness, respect and diligence – use your year in office to leave the 'right' mark at Ridgeway, be remembered for the 'right' reasons and continue to serve the school and the community.


